FBP suggests ICE & CBP leaders go back to work after 22 month vacation

Today, across America hundreds of thousands of illegal aliens and their supporters have taken to the streets to flaunt their rejection of Federal Immigration Laws. However, this is taking place because CBP and ICE have let political policies, benefitting a foreign government obstruct US Immigration Laws.
